What SSI does

SSI is a not-for-profit organisation that provides support for vulnerable communities in NSW:

- Refugees and humanitarian entrants
- People seeking asylum who live in the Australian community
- Children from CALD backgrounds who need out-of-home care
- People with disability, carers and families
- Newly arrived migrants through the NSW Settlement Partnership
- People seeking employment



THE NUMBER OF SERVICES SSI CURRENTLY PROVIDES, TO A RANGE OF CLIENTS. THESE SERVICES ARE:

Humanitarian Settlement Services (HSS), for refugees and humanitarian entrants

Status Resolution Support Services (SRSS), for asylum seekers living in the community

Housing Services, for HSS and SRSS clients

Multicultural Foster Care Service, for children from CALD backgrounds who require out-of-home care

Ability Links NSW, to foster full and active participation of people with disabilities in their communities

Ignite Small Business Start-ups, a self-funded enterprise facilitation initiative for refugees

Jobactive employment services, for job seekers in the Sydney East Metro area

Ignite Small Business Start-ups

SSI Community Engagement

Seeks to link isolated clients, such as asylum seekers and those with disabilities to new contacts and community groups





SSI Ability Links NSW

Ability Links NSW links people with disability, their families and carers to their community to set and achieve goals, build confidence and expand networks

Linkers work with individuals, businesses and other community groups to support them to be welcoming and inclusive
