





- Inaugural Roundtable on CVE 2008
- CVE Sub Committee of ANZCTC and National Framework to CVE





- Active Member of the CVE Sub Committee of ANZCTC
- Since 2010 funded for a number of initiatives
- Late 2014 developed proposal for an early intervention program
- Minister for Multiculturalism currently leading the consultation phase which will enable us to develop programs

- ICCT Research Paper identified two Major Gaps
 - First Lack of willingness to look more critically at the role of Media and the internet (this may be changing)
 - Second lack of the formulation of an effective counter narrative to the single narrative being pursued by Terrorist organisations that Islam is under attack





- ICCT Research Paper Recommendations include:
 - Strengthen public resilience
 - Enhance social cohesion
 - Prevent and counter hate speech, extremist propaganda and ill founded conspiracy theories
 - Propagate and demonstrate good governance and develop inclusive institutions to provide peaceful, gradual, reformist social and political flexibility and change.

Responding to the Egypt Crisis

'Australia is my inspiration for helping others'

Leena Mourad, a 22-year-old from Sydney, is currently working with a humanitarian organisation in Egypt to help improve the lives of locals as they face major political and social upheaval. She credits her life in Australia with setting her on a path to helping others. This is Leena's story about her experiences in Egypt.

I WAS born and raised in Australia and my background is Egyptian - so I would classify myse as an Egyptian Australian.

I have travelled to Egypt every year for the past seven years to spend my three-month summer holiday in Egypt.

In July, I travelled to India to undertake humanitarian work and after an amazing experience I decided that it would make perfect sense to take my passion for human rights and put it to good use in Egypt.

I am currently working with a reputable organisation in Egypt and enjoying the work immensely.

I have always felt safe in Egypt, no matter the circumstances; it may be a little naive of me but I carry a constant faith in the Egyptian people.

Tackling the online hate of right-wing extremism

A new online hate reporting tool will be shared with government departments, police and non-government organisations to help locate and tackle the online racism fuelling right-wing extremism in Australia.

The user-based reporting software, Fight Against Hate, has been developed by Dr Andre Oboler, chief executive of the Online Hate Prevention Institute (OHPI) and allows registered users to report cyber-based bigotry and bullying. This information is then collated by a 'backend tool' that could advise on counter strategies.

The software's launch, which took place on Tuesday December 9 in Sydney, comes in the wake of the federal government introducing the Enhancing Online Safety For Children Bill to parliament. Geared towards protecting youth from online hate, it instigates a review by a Children's e-safety Commissioner who could then instruct the removal of offensive material and issue fines to perpetrators and social media companies

Australians fighting in Syria: What's their future?

Australians who travel to Syria to fight in the conflict may pose a risk to Australia, a leading academic has warned.

Andrew Zammit, from Monash University's Global Terrorism Research Centre, says Australians returning from fighting in Syria could pose a security risk, though a "careful, nonblanket approach" is needed when dealing with returned fighters.

"If some of the Australians fighting adopted in Syria al-Qaeda's worldview ... they may become involved in attempted terrorist attacks against Australia, and have gained deadly skills from their experience." Mr Zammit said.

At least four Australians have been killed in Syria since the beginning of the civil war, and the Australian Federal Police (AFP) has threatened "serious criminal penalties" for all Australians. including dual citizens, who provide any kind of support to any armed group in Syria.

The Federal Government says it acknowledges the National Coalition for Syrian Revolutionary and Opposition Forces as the "legitimate representative" of the Syrian people.

However, the Government this month listed the Al-Nusrah Front, which is also fighting parimet the Ovine regime as a terregist evantisation following concerns over the group's


