



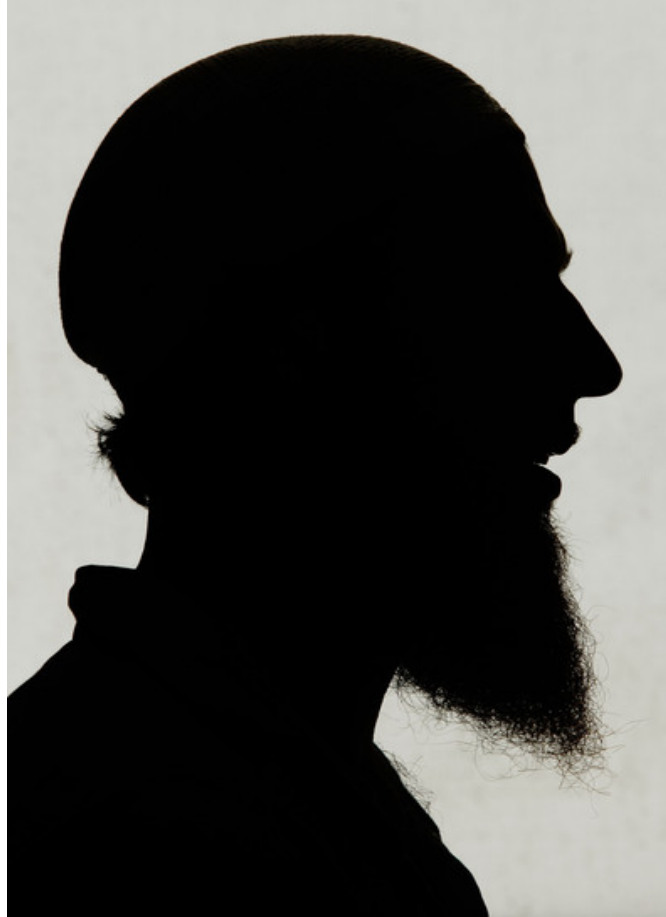
Mosques, Muslim Leaders and Social Cohesion

- Recording of 48 mosque sermons
- 12 in the week immediately after the Martin Place Siege
- Access and ethical considerations
- Coding and analysis
