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




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About His Holiness

His Holiness Mirza Masroor Ahmad (Mir-za Mas-roor Ah-mad), is the fifth Khalifa (Caliph) of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community. Elected to this lifelong position on 22nd April 2003, he serves as the worldwide spiritual and administrative head of an international religious organisation with membership exceeding 10's of millions

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Various caliphates declared after 1900 [edit]

Since the dissolution of the Ottoman Empire, there has been no single recognized, "ecumenical" caliphate.

Sharifian Caliphate (1924) [edit]

Main article: Sharifian Caliphate

A last attempt at restoring the caliphal office and style with ecumenical recognition was made by Hussein bin Ali, King of Hejaz and Sharif of Mecca, who assumed both on 11 March 1924 and held them until 3 October 1924, when he passed the kingship to his son 'Ali ibn al-Husayn al-Hashimi, who did not adopt the caliphal office and style. [19] Hussein's claim for caliphate was not accepted however, and in 1925 he was driven from Hejaz by the forces of Ibn Saud due to his lack of support for Shari'ah. He continued to use the title of caliph during his remaining life in exile, until his death in 1931.

Ahmadiyya Muslim Caliphate (1908-present) [edit]

Khalīfatul Masīh (Arabic: خليفة المسيح; Urdu: خليفة المسيح; English: Successor of the Messiah) or Khalifa of Islam (Caliph of Islam)^[20] sometimes simply referred to as *Khalifah* (i.e. Caliph, successor) is the elected spiritual and organizational leader of the worldwide Ahmadiyya Muslim Community and is the successor of Mirza Ghulam Ahmad of Qadian (d.1908) who had claimed to be the Mahdi and messiah in Islam. The Caliph is believed to be divinely guided and is also referred to by members of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community as Amir al-Mu'minin (Leader of the Faithful). The fifth and current Khalifatul Masih is Mirza Masroor Ahmad.

After the death of Ghulam Ahmad, his successors directed the Ahmadiyya Community from Qadian which remained the headquarters of the community until 1947 with the creation of Pakistan. From this time on the headquarters remained in Rabwah, a town built on land bought in

Pakistan by the community in 1948. In 1984, Ordinance XX was promulgated by the government of Pakistan which rendered the Khalifatul Masih unable to perform his duties and put the very institution in jeopardy. Due to these circumstances, Khalifatul Masih IV left Pakistan and migrated to London, England, provisionally moving the headquarters to the Fazl Mosque. [21]

ISIL claim (2014-present) [edit]

On 29 June 2014, the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) started to call itself "Islamic State" and call its leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi "caliph Ibrahim". [23] [24] The validity of this caliphate has not been recognized by any Islamic authority outside of the 10-million-people territory. [25] under control of Islamic State. [26]

On 24 August 2014, the leader of Boko Haram in Nigeria, Abubakar Shekau, likewise declared a caliphate. Apparently, it remained unclear whether Shekau declared his group to be part of ISIL or if he was declaring a separate caliphate in Nigeria. [27] On 7 March 2015, Shekau pledged allegiance to ISIL via an audio message posted on the organisation's Twitter account. [28] [29] Afterwards, Boko Haram assumed the name "Wilāyat al Sūdān al Gharbī" (Arabic: ولاية السودان الغربي, "West Africa Province") or "Islamic State in West Africa" (Iswap). [30]

Mosque to say thanks

A BLACKTOWN mosque invites the wider community to celebrate Australia Day with them in a celebration to be held on Sunday, January 25, 5pm-7pm.

The mosque's national external affairs director, Mirza Ramzan Sharif, said that after the Martin Place siege and the Charlie Hebdo killings, the celebrations came at a time when they were most needed for those of the Islamic faith.

The theme of the day will be Thank You Australia.

"And we want our people to understand that it is not about what Australia has given me but what we have given Australia," Mr Sharif said.

He said it was frustrating for Muslims to see others commit acts of violence in the name of Islam.

"These events have nothing to do with Islam, these global events and atrocities that we see," he said.

"We want to promote and instil in the minds of the audience and the children the saying of the holy Prophet: 'Love of your country is part of one's faith.'

"Not a single person with this twisted, brainwashed mentality comes from our community."

Organisers are anticipating more than 1000 people for the celebrations, including members of the mosque community, dignitaries from the three tiers of government and others from the broader community.

Muslim leaders will use the event to send a positive message of peace, with guest speakers and an afternoon tea part of the itinerary.

"We'll have formal speeches, a lot of interaction between the broader community and our community . . . we will bring the community together basically, like we do every year," he

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Mosque leaders condemn fatal siege

LEADERS from the Ahmadiyya Muslim Association's mosque in Langwarrin "categorically and unequivocally" condemned the Sydney siege that led to the deaths of two hostages held at gunpoint in a cafe by Man Haron Monis.

Monis, who forced hostages to hold up a flag proclaiming. "There is no god but Allah and Mohammad is his messenger" was shot dead after police stormed the Lindt Cafe early Tuesday morning.

In Sydney for a conference during Monday's siege in Martin Place, Ahmadiyya spokesman Aziz Bhatii said Islam "categorically rejects all kinds of violence and killings of innocent people".

In the wake of the riege police from Carrum Downs offered protection against "any negative behaviour or attitudes" to members of the Bait-ul-Salam (House of Peace) mosque in Languwinn.

The police emailed the mosque they "wanted to ensure that if you experience or become aware of any negative behaviour or attitudes towards the Ahmadiyya Muslim Association or anyone connected to the association, that you alert us to this, as it will not be tolerated and we would like to deal with it as quickly as possible".

Mr Bhatti said no members of the congregation had reported being subjected to any negative behaviour as a

result of the siege.

The association categorically and unequivocally condemns the terror

"This city [Sydney] has been shaken by a tragedy. I'm shocked and strongly reject any atrocity on the lives of the innocent. Such actions are criminal.
