Due by August 31, 2017

Extended abstract should be formatted as follows,

- Pages with all margins set at 2.54 cms
- Spacing should be set at 1.5 lines
- Title in Times New Roman 14 pt bold centred
- Headings should be in Times New Roman 12 pt bold
- Sub-headings should be in Times New Roman 12 pt bold italic
- The body text of your abstract should be aligned to both left and right margins, and be written in Times New Roman 12 pt.
- Any figures or tables can be in black and white, or colour, located directly in the text
- Figures should have at least a 300 dpi resolution
- Where appropriate, a full reference list should follow your abstract
- Reference style: Harvard (see below)
- Extended Abstract Headings: Introduction/ Purpose/ Literature Review/ Methodology/ Results/ Discussion and conclusions

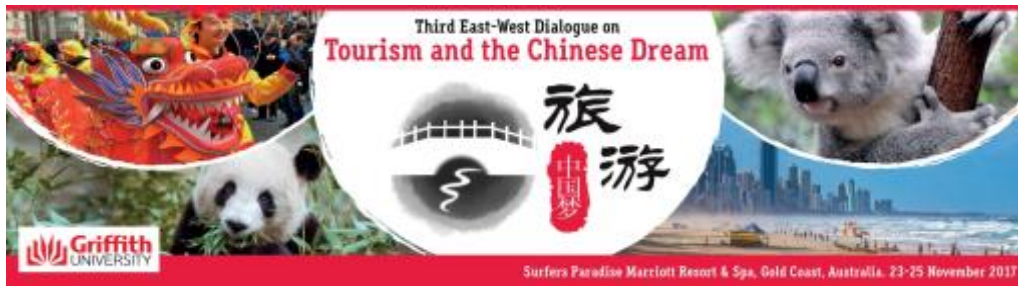

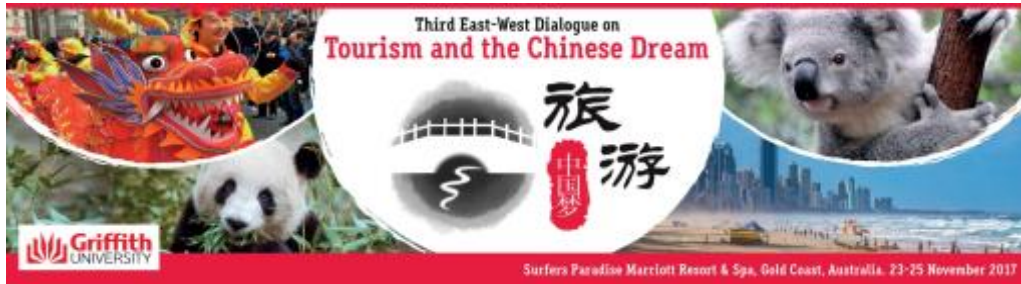

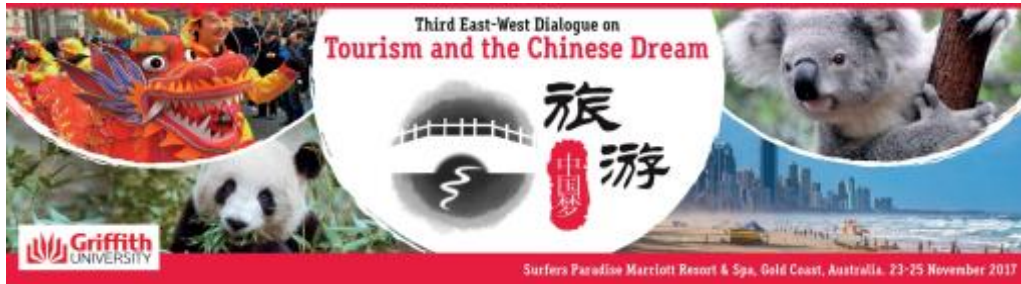
